

Message from our 2010 Conference Program Chairs

The <u>Annual Fall FATE Conference</u> is well underway and promises to be very informative! A tremendous amount of planning has already been done to provide every educator in the State an enlightening and beneficial two days. The conference will be held at the <u>Hilton in St. Petersburg Carillon Park</u> on **Friday and Saturday, October 8–9, 2010**.



The theme is **Transforming Teacher Preparation for the 21**st **Century: Needs, Challenges, and Best Practices.** The strands include Partnerships with K-12 Schools, and Collaboration with Colleges of Arts & Sciences and with Alternate Pathways;
Technology & Teacher Preparation; Evidence-Based Assessment; Urban Education, Globalization, and Diversity; Induction, Mentoring, and Teacher Retention; and Research and Development.

We have made every effort to include representatives from public and independent Florida colleges and universities. On Friday, there will be three sessions beginning at 12:30pm. These include Assessment and Accreditation, Technology and Teacher Education, and a Student Showcase poster session for undergraduates. Following these sessions, there will be a Florida panel discussion by several key leaders across the State.

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The keynote presentation on Friday will begin at 5:00pm by **Sarah Enterline** from Boston College Lynch School of Education. She will speak on **Using Assessments and Evidence to Engage in Informed Programmatic Decision Making** with an emphasis on assessment in Florida. Dinner at your choice of restaurants will include conversations with leaders across the State.

The Saturday luncheon speaker is Larry Daniel, President, Teacher Educators Council of State Colleges and Universities, NCATE Blue Ribbon Panel, SUS Deans. He will speak on the National Landscape of Teacher Education and Its Future. Immediately following this presentation, there will be a brainstorming session of Florida teacher educators.

In addition, every FATE member has the opportunity to submit a proposal to present on Saturday morning or afternoon. See the FATE website for further information. Check out the <u>Awards</u> link and send in your nominations as well. We hope to see you in October.
